Zebra Construction Company is a large regional concrete and masonry subcontractor serving the commercial building market in the southeast. Zebra, based outside of Atlanta, GA, performs multi-million dollar contracts for major projects such as schools, medical centers, corrections facilities and a variety of large commercial construction jobs.

Founded in 1999 by President and CEO Chip Kessler - a 25-year construction industry veteran - Zebra immediately experienced rapid growth and success. Following Kessler's firm belief in over-delivering for his clients, the firm soon became a major player in the region's commercial building trade. As a result, management recognized the need for a larger modern facility, complete with advanced AV and presentation systems, to occupy the company headquarters.

State-of-the-art AV presentation systems were installed and managed using Crestron control solutions. (ISS).

- Formal and enhanced training facilities for employees of all levels
- Impressive entertainment space for client appreciation and relationship building purposes.
- A feature-rich system that was easy to operate by any level user and aesthetically pleasing with the new interior decor.

Maintaining a healthy pipeline of new business development is a top priority at Zebra. First impressions matter and Zebra immediately sets itself apart from the competition by delivering high caliber presentations to its prospects and clients. The new boardroom was designed explicitly for this purpose.

From the in-room computer, a Panasonic 3000 Lumens WXGA widescreen projector feeds presentation content to a high definition SmartBoard interactive electronic whiteboard.

Crestron MC2E Compact Control System with on board Ethernet integrates all audio and video components into a powerful, centrally managed rackmount solution. Flush mounted in the boardroom conference table, QM-FTCC-TPS4 3.6" FlipTop Touchpanel Computer Center enables complete room control of all the technology.

Based on input from Zebra managers, customized GUI commands were programmed by ISS and provide a user-friendly interface on the active matrix touchpanel. When video is required from the Blu-ray DVD player or another input, a simple button touch lowers a 7' wide projection screen directly in front of the SmartBoard and the video is queued.

The FlipTop computer center provides convenient connectivity for a presenter to connect a laptop and instantly gain access to the room's state-of-the-art AV system – including Internet.

Crestron QM-MD5X1 AV switcher seamlessly routes audio and video signals from the touchpanel to both screens and the projector while occupying a single rackmount slot. Revolutionary

QuickMedia® technology enabled seamless inter-communication of the room and eliminated cumbersome cabling requirements, making installation fast, easy and cost-effective.

The new system has already provided measurable benefits for Zebra including:

The Training Room – Keeping Employees Connected to Industry Trends, OSHA Compliance and Management's Goals

To keep staff of all levels – including superintendents, engineers, estimators, project managers, architects, CAD designers - up to date on the latest industry trends and OSHA safety bulletins, current projects, internal administrative topics and management strategies, a dedicated training room was designed with advanced AV and presentation technology.

Considering the complexity of the training room design, which includes side-by-side electronic white boards, DVD player, two satellite feeds, CD recorder, two wireless headset mics and a high end audio system, it was a challenge to provide a robust AV system while retaining ease-of-use for both staff and outside trainers/lecturers. A Crestron MC2E Control System with Ethernet seamlessly integrates all components while providing trainers simple and total control of the room, giving Zebra the easy-to-use/high-powered flexibility combination it demanded.

Two Panasonic DLP projectors transmit computer graphics, DVD video and dual HDTV satellite feeds onto a custom made double-wide SmartBoard with a viewing area 15 feet wide. A Crestron UPX-2-1GB Universal Presentation Processor combines multiple window video processing with complete touchpanel control and flexible real-time annotation functionality. Integrated with Crestron DTT-15V3 DualTouch™ Technology Touchpanel, this solution provides trainers/lecturers unique and unmatched capabilities such as:

- Projecting multiple-window viewing to the audience
- Independent output control allows trainers to preview multi-source, multi-window content - including full-motion video - on the touchscreen prior to showing it on the room screen
- Easily annotate, draw or type directly over any computer or video source right on the touchscreen via integrated MediaMarker™ technology



- Save, edit and share annotated screen shots, in a variety of formats, for future use
- Simple, easy-to-use interface that allows trainers to focus on teaching, not on system operation

In addition to its limitless presentation features, the DTT-15V3 enables easy and complete whole room control right from the touchscreen. Plus, an outside trainer also has the choice of using the room computer or quickly connecting a laptop at the lectern, providing added flexibility.

"Programming of the touchpanel by ISS was approached with the idea of enabling novice users to quickly determine how to operate the system, as the client requested. User training was therefore very minimal, increasing productivity while saving time and money. Even the complexity of the UPX in the training room has become easy for them to maneuver by presenting a logical flow to the screens," explains Shields.

Limited by space and connectivity options, QuickMedia technology sends and receives all audio, video and computer signals to the projector over inexpensive Cat5e cabling, reducing bulky and costly cabling requirements, simplifying installation. A custom built lectern serves a dual purpose, discreetly hiding and securing the rackmountable solution.

A Digital Projection 1080p projector feeds a choice of two DirecTV HD satellite feeds or Blu-ray DVD signals to a custom-made 10' wide screen, providing what may be the highest resolution video available in a home theater today.

A Panasonic 50" HD Plasma provides an additional high quality display for guests to view multiple events. When it's time to get down to business the large screen plasma also serves as a computer monitor for informal presentations and a variety of meeting needs.

Crestron ST-1700C 5.7" color touchpanel consolidates whole room control into a compact but powerful control center, either docked or wireless. QuickMedia technology interconnects the entire system into a robust, yet easily controlled client entertainment theater solution.
